CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

CBC Fremantle is a Catholic school in the tradition of Edmund Rice for boys in Years 7 to 12. The College has a long association with the Port City and traces its origins back to 1882 when the Fremantle Boys' Catholic School was first opened in High Street in a building that is now the College chapel. In 1901 the Christian Brothers took charge of the school and had responsibility for the governance of the College until 1 October 2007. On this date, Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) was established ushering in a new and exciting phase of governance for Australia's Edmund Rice schools.

The College embraces the four guiding Touchstones of the EREA charter. The Touchstones perpetuate the legacy of Blessed Edmund Rice, capture the character and culture of EREA schools, and challenge the staff, leaders, students and families to be faithful to this ethos.

Liberating Education – We open hearts and minds, through quality teaching and learning experiences, so that through critical reflection and engagement each person is hope-filled and free to build a better world for all.

Gospel Spirituality – We invite all people into the story of Jesus and strive to make his message of compassion, justice and peace a living reality within our community.

Inclusive Community – Our community is accepting and welcoming, fostering right relationships and committed to the common good.

Justice and Solidarity – We are committed to justice and peace for all, grounded in a spirituality of action and reflection that calls us to stand in solidarity with those who are marginalised and the Earth itself.



WORKFORCE COMPOSITION 2020



Indigenous Full-time Staff




Non-Indigenous Part-time Staff




TEACHERS' QUALIFICATIONS 2020

STUDENT ATTENDANCE 2020




PARENT SATISFACTION

In the 2018 survey, the majority of parents considered their expectations based on their reasons for choosing CBC Fremantle were met or significantly exceeded.




SCHOOL INCOME
