FROM THE PRINCIPALS

It is great to see the enthusiasm and energy that all of our students are showing as we near the end of Term 2. The last few weeks have been filled with activity and learning. On Monday our Rm 4, Rm 9 and T 10 classes enjoyed an excursion to the Maritime Museum with some very fortunate students participating in the official opening and information session of the ECOCEAN Whale Shark race. We were delighted to listen to Prof Lyn Beazley (former Chief Scientist of WA) and Dr Brad Norman (Director of ECOCEAN) as they spoke about the project and the status of whale sharks. Our students are already very engaged with researching information about these magnificent creatures and we really look forward to monitoring our whale shark using the ZoaTrack website when the race officially starts on August 14th.

Yesterday the Premier announced that a new secondary school will be built on Kitchener Park in Subiaco. This school will be a local intake school and is expected to relieve the current enrolment pressure on Shenton College and Churchlands SHS. The school will open for Year 7 intake in 2020 and is expected to have up to 2000 students by 2025. This announcement means that Perth Modern School will remain in its current location.

Student reports are currently being completed by class and specialist teachers. All reports will be made available in the final week of the term. Parents are invited to take up the opportunity to meet with their child's teacher to discuss student progress over this first semester. Reading through reports it is obvious that the students have been working really hard and deserve to be proud of their efforts throughout the first two terms.

Finally, I will be taking Long Service Leave for the last 3 days of this term and first two weeks of next term. Pamela Chatfield will be undertaking the role of Principal during this time.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT PLAN 2017 (III)

All students make poor decisions at times, because they are still learning how they need to approach the difficulties they encounter in life. We expect that. When they make decisions that do not help them or others, as adults, we need to step in and guide them. In order to do this, we have taken a restorative justice approach in our new Positive Behaviour Support Plan. We ask questions designed to help them work through their thinking and reflect on their actions in order to make better decisions later and to make up for their current mistake. We have written reflection sheets for students to reflect on their behaviour and we ask them questions verbally to help support them in their understanding of their behaviour. You may wish to use these at home:

K-2 Questions	Years 3-6	
What happened?	Responding to the challenging behaviour (doer)	Responding to who has been harmed (victim)
How did that make you feel?	What happened?	What did you think when you realised what had happened?
So what you're saying is when --- behaviour--- happened you felt ---emotion---	What were you thinking of at the time?	What impact has this incident had on you and others?
What can you do to solve the problem?	What have you thought about since?	What has been the hardest thing for you?
What do you need from (the other person) to solve the problem?	Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?	What do you think needs to happen to make things right?
Is the problem solved?	What do you think you need to do to make it right?	

The purpose of these strategies is to ensure that when a problem occurs, an adult supports the child to manage the behaviour; to repair, rebuild and reconnect with the class so that they can begin a fresh start once the issue is dealt with.

Our Positive Behaviour Support Plan will soon be available on our new-look website. We hope to have a parent information session next term to further explain the Plan for interested parents.

The students completed some traditional patterned *kiri-e* (cut-out pictures) and listened to ToyToy play the *tonkori* and the *mukkuri*. The Ainu people believe that no-one owns anything, that everything should be shared and every non-living thing has a spirit that should be cared for and nurtured. 
